Cllr Ian Bint

Cllr. Rob Waltham leader of North Lincolnshire Council & I had a meeting with a director, asset manager and operations manager of Yorkshire Water about the continuing water supply issues.

I will provide more information as things progress but here are the main points.

I am pleased to report that we secured confirmation that a major investment in water infrastructure and network capacity for the Crowle area has been approved and funded by Yorkshire Water's Board. This is a significant step forward and represents a major commitment to improving the resilience and reliability of the local water supply for residents and businesses.

We made it clear that local people want to see improvements delivered as quickly as possible and that delays are not acceptable. As a result, we have agreed to hold a further meeting with Yorkshire Water and the highways team to continue pressing for a timely programme of works.



We also raised residents' concerns about the disruption that major infrastructure projects can cause. We have asked Yorkshire Water to work closely with highways and other utility companies to ensure works are coordinated wherever possible, helping to minimise road closures, traffic delays and repeated digging up of roads.

There is still work to do, but this is a very positive development for Crowle. We will continue to hold Yorkshire Water to account and keep residents updated as plans progress.

There are three schemes in their capital programme that affect Axholme North. Being in the capital programme means they have the money to deliver them and they are not simply wishes.

1. Is a mains renewal scheme underway around south Goole that will affect Garthorpe and Fockerby this is currently underway.

2 Is the upgrade of the 7-inch supply pipe into Crowle to a 315mm (12- inch pipe). This work is extensive and stretches from Belton through the A161 in Crowle and up Mill Road. I am attending the planning meeting on 22 July when I will learn more.

3. Is the creation of a new service reservoir in Crowle that will triple the water storage capacity of the water tower. Land negotiations are ongoing to secure the site.

There is also a promise to improve the claims process when guaranteed service standards are not met.

When I know more, I will update but it was a positive update with funded solutions.

Yorkshire Water Information

Hi, Yorkshire Water here! 💧 We wanted to give our customers in Swinefleet a heads up that we're replacing ageing water pipes in your

area with the help of our partner, United Infrastructure. This project will improve the supply of clean water to the area.

The first phase of the work will begin on 13.7.26.

To keep everybody safe, there will be two-way traffic lights on Main Street at Reedness, and we will need to close the private road at Old Hill Cottages, Reedness, DN14 8HD until 24.7.26.

In addition, from 13.7.26 there will be multiway lights on Low Street in Swinefleet until 28 8.26. Our work will progress onto Goole Road where two-way traffic lights will be in place from Mon 24 August until 16.10.26

From Monday 27.7.26 Old Lane, Reedness will be closed until 21.9.26 S. Where road closures are in place, access will be maintained for residents within the closure and emergency services. All other traffic there will be signed diversion.

We're hoping to have finished the overall project by Summer 2027 and will be in touch with more details as the project progresses. In the meantime, please plan if you're travelling in the area and thanks for bearing with us.

Yorkshire Water and other "Consultation" Events

Last month, Yorkshire Water hired the hall to give residents a chance to hear more about their mains replacement plans. We hope at least some of you were able to attend and tell them what you thought about their service. It is a shame that these events take place during the working day, but this is out of our hands.

It is worth noting that we charge commercial hirers like Yorkshire Water a commercial rate for their use of the hall. As well as providing an opportunity for us all to ask questions etc, these types of hire contribute to the running costs of the hall and help us ensure that hire

rates for private and community hires can be kept as low as possible.

Party season

The calendar is full of fun. Not only do we have Party in the Park (1st August, in case you have not noticed) but the hall is also in use for two private family birthday parties. These events take place alongside the usual regular events, and we hope the families concerned have a really good time.

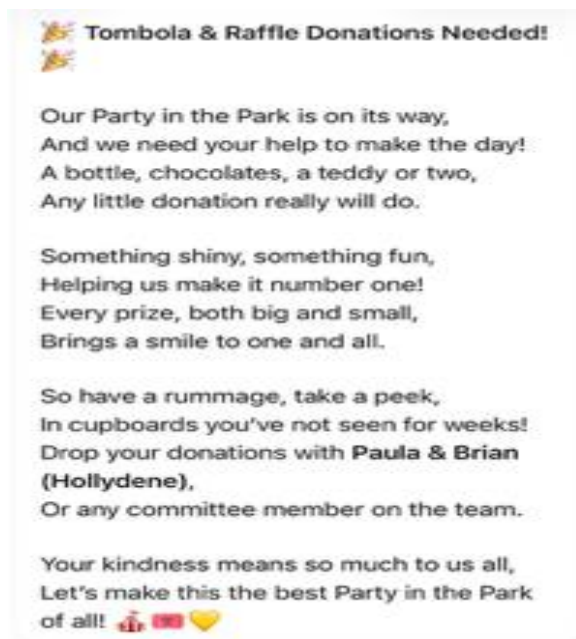

The story telling by writer/director Gillian Vickers and her company was sometimes poignant, sometimes funny but always clear, focused and utterly committed. I've seen examples of community theatre which has had budgets of tens of thousands played with far less integrity and commitment than what I saw last night. Well done everyone. Really lovely work.

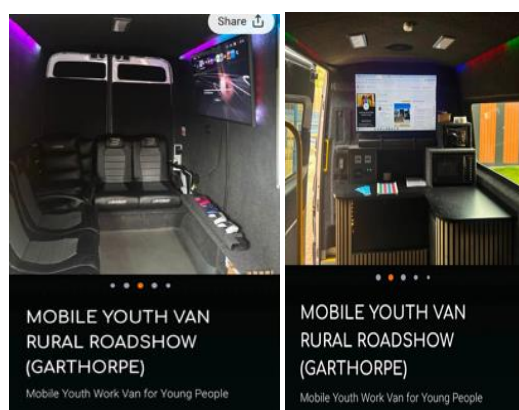

From The Vicar

In the church year, we've now come to that long season- it seems to go on forever- variously called 'Trinity' or 'Ordinary time'. Each of those labels tells us something about the approximately six months between Pentecost and Advent Sunday. 'Trinity' reminds us that with Pentecost, God has made himself known to us in all his fullness (or at least as much as we can bear) as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. 'Ordinary time' tells us that this

is the season where, now armed with the insights and power of the Holy Spirit, we can revisit the life of Jesus with new eyes, new heart, see new things in the faith, see new opportunities to serve God.

This is the time when those words of Jesus (John 15 v15) 'I have made known to you everything I have learned from the Father' come into play. It may seem a long season, it may feel like the drudgery of 'Keep on keeping on' without the excitement of Christmas, Easter and Pentecost to lift our spirits, but it is ordinary time charged with the knowledge that we have everything we need in the resources of God. The love of the Father, the words and works of the Son, the power of the Spirit will energise us as we 'keep on keeping on' through this long season.

This long season up to the end of November is a reminder that working out our love for God in our community is probably more about perspiration than inspiration. Few are called to be heroes of the faith, but all are called to faithfulness, and somehow or other, with the transforming power of the Spirit, we are all able to keep on keeping on, doing little things with great love.

Here's a prayer which captures some of the mindset of the Trinity season/Ordinary time; it may help you 'keep on keeping on' through the months ahead;

Let not our soul be busy inns that have not room for thee and thine, but quiet homes of prayer and praise where thou mayest find fit company; where the needful cares of life are wisely ordered and put away, and wide sweet space is kept for thee.

Amen to that. Ordinary - but challenging!

Sarah McQuaid review

Sarah McQuaid, singer, songwriter and multi-instrumentalist can truly be described as 'international'. She was born in Spain, raised in the USA, moved to Ireland where she married, and has lived for the past 20 years in Cornwall. Her style is warm and relaxed, equally at home with guitar or electric piano or both, looping in percussion and vocals too, creating a soundscape that is both professional and entertaining.

Most of the set was her own compositions, but Sarah also gave us a moving version of Ewan McColl's 'The First Time Ever I Saw Your Face' and two traditional folk songs. The stand out for me was Sarah's 'The Silence Above Us', an atmospheric melody woven round haunting lyrics which transported you to a dark Winter's night.

I very much liked the newer songs which will be on Sarah's next album, suggesting that her enthusiasm and inspiration remain undiminished. So all in all an excellent evening from an excellent performer. A mention too for Martin Dansbury. He is Sarah's manager and sound engineer, Sarah writes and performs, Martin does everything else.
