### Yorkshire Water Information

Hi, Yorkshire Water here! We wanted to give our customers in Swinefleet a heads up that we're replacing ageing water pipes in your area with the help of our partner, United Infrastructure. This project will improve the supply of clean water to the area.

The first phase of the work will begin on 13.7.26.

To keep everybody safe, there will be two-way traffic lights on Main Street at Reedness, and we will need to close the private road at Old Hill Cottages, Reedness, DN14 8HD until 24.7.26.

In addition, from 13.7.26 there will be multiway lights on Low Street in Swinefleet until 28.8.26. Our work will progress onto Goole Road where two-way traffic lights will be in place from Mon 24 August until 16.10.26

From Monday 27.7.26 Old Lane, Reedness will be closed until 21.9.26. Where road closures

are in place, access will be maintained for residents within the closure and emergency services. All other traffic there will be signed diversion.

We're hoping to have finished the overall project by Summer 2027 and will be in touch with more details as the project progresses. In the meantime, please plan if you're travelling in the area and thanks for bearing with us.

### **Village perspective on Yorkshire water**

Various residents have expressed concern about our Water Tower, whether it's up to the job and about a report from about 15 years ago suggesting it needed upgrading. I have been informed by YW's Corporate Affairs manager that the Water Tower is not operational, Garthorpe's water is pumped direct from Crowle. There are no plans to remove the tower, the cost would be enormous.

The recent replacement of the water main at Eastoft with a larger one, and the planned upgrade of the main supply to Crowle, will apparently safeguard our supply into the future.

In the meantime all the pigs have been issued with flying hats and goggles and are ready to go.

We'll wait and see.

### **LIVES Community First Responders update**



A massive thank you to all the villagers who pulled together to raise sufficient funds to cover the cost of ALL FOUR paramedic bags for our local Community First Responders. It's an understatement to say the responders are thrilled and very much appreciative of the amazing response. The bags have been ordered and are scheduled to be delivered to the responders on Wednesday 9th September. Photos to follow.

Have you ever wondered how LIVES Community First Responders (CFR's) are deployed? LIVES CFRs are deployed by East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS) and on

arrival at an address or the scene of an incident they act as an EMAS resource providing potentially lifesaving treatment until such time as an ambulance or EMAS fast response vehicle arrives on scene. The responders then provide a clinical handover to the EMAS crew who take over the care of the patient or patients.

LIVES CFRs are volunteers. They commit to volunteer at least 16 hours per month and frequently volunteer many more hours. When volunteering CFR's log on with EMAS who dispatch them to emergency 999 calls from the control room in either Lincoln or Nottingham. The responders then travel in their own cars to the incident. CFRs can attend a variety of emergencies including medical emergencies, trauma, paediatrics and road traffic collisions

In some urgent or life-threatening cases CFR's who are not logged on duty can be called by EMAS to ask if they are willing to attend and deal with the case. Invariably the CFRs will stop what they're doing and attend.

LIVES CFR's all hold nationally recognised qualifications in pre-hospital emergency care. On the Isle we are very fortunate to have CFR's, Senior CFR's, Paramedics and Critical Care Paramedics available to provide excellent patient care. We are also soon to have an Emergency Medical Doctor join us.

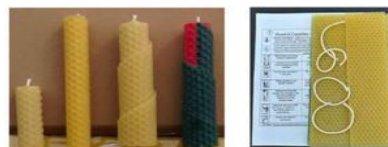

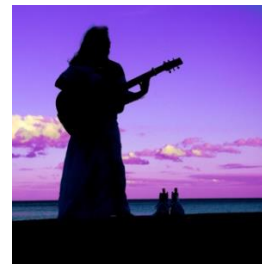

It is the middle of August as I write this article, a hectic time for me as I have Nana duties for most of the summer break (7 weeks this year!). But it is an enjoyable time when chores and non-urgent jobs go on a waiting list to be tackled once school has returned for the Autumn term. So once again I am burning the

midnight oil but all is quiet in the bedrooms as little people regenerate ready for tomorrow and another fun packed day. For me it's about the companionship they bring me. It's not much good doing anything exciting if you can't share it with somebody. It's so much more friendly with two (or three or four!). When I think about it, it is exactly what IEM aims to do – bringing people together to combat loneliness and take part in activities. Some workshops we offer are indeed exciting and certainly very varied.

Back to what has been happening recently. The bee keeping experience was thoroughly enjoyed by all the participants. There was a delayed start due to the rain in the night making the conditions not suitable until the sun got out and dried everything up. All were suited up in white overalls, headgear and gloves to get close and personal with the bees. They discovered the intricate life cycle of bees, hive dynamics and also how honey is harvested – all this being a completely hands-on experience, not just watching how it is all done. They were shown how to spot the Queen Bee and witnessed young bees emerging from their cells. At the end of the 2 hours there was a honey tasting session, sampling different varieties of honey and learning how each is made. A different, very exciting workshop.

The forging workshops went well. A maximum of 3 people can attend each one and between the 6 people who attended the advanced workshops, the following items were made: - a toasting fork, 2 garden stakes with a hook on the top on which to hang a bird feeder, plant bucket or other item, an axe, a hole puncher, a small knife, a bottle opener and a long hook. Andy who owns the forge is a superb teacher with bags of patience and creative ideas. If we let him know before of an item you wish to make, he will do his best to make it viable or adapt it in some way to gain the same/similar end piece. The beginners forging workshop had to be postponed due to the exceptional temperatures we have been enduring but is booked for a later date. There is just one more advanced workshop to take place in October.

Our IEM annual afternoon tea took place on 27th June and was again a roaring success. 48 people attended and a super time was had by all. Some faces were new to this popular event which means we are growing in numbers and achieving getting people together to meet others. Feedback sheets are completed at the end of the afternoon, and the consensus of opinion was to hold more of these events. To this end we are arranging a Christmas bash on the 5th of December, once again in Whitgift church and with the same entertainer we had for the afternoon tea. It will be cheese and wine with accompaniments; plus, mulled wine as befits the season together with Xmas cake. There will also be a quiz and a raffle just as these things are always popular at our afternoon tea event. The quiz is done as a team on each table which allows people who do not know one another to converse and break the ice. The fused glass lantern workshop which was to be held in July had to be postponed by the tutor due to personal reasons and will now take place on Sunday 25th October from 2pm-4pm at Swinefleet village hall. Cost is £50. You will go home with a four-panel glass lantern, the glass of which has been designed and painted by you. There are still places that can be booked onto this workshop.
